La Dictée P.G.L. is a major educational project first implemented in 1991 in Canada, the United States, and Africa.

The project takes a fun approach to learning in order to raise young people's awareness of the world's most pressing issues (such as international cooperation, respect and solidarity, and environmental protection) while improving their use and mastery of the French language. To that end, the Fondation Paul Gérin-Lajoie provides students and teachers with free, turnkey educational tools.

La Dictée P.G.L. also gives students the opportunity to participate in challenging and fun competitions that each year culminate in the International Grand Finale for Grades 5 and 6 and the National Junior High Grand Finale for Grades 7 and 8.


Working TOGETHER for Equal Opportunities

When you sign up to participate in La Dictée P.G.L., you receive free educational tools that leverage best teaching practices.





DECEMBER—JANUARY: IN-CLASS COMPONENT

Stage 1 · In-class activities

- Explore the theme and complete the activities in Mon magazine.
- Participate in the Sponsored Dictation of the P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser.

It takes about two weeks to complete the activities in Mon Magazine. Plan one week for the sponsored dictation.

Once the in-class activities have been completed, you can participate in the following optional project components. This is the project's competitive component.

FEBRUARY 1-15: START OF THE COMPETITIVE COMPONENT

Stage 2 · School Finale

- All participating students take part in this finale proposing a grade level-appropriate dictation.
- At the elementary level, students in the Grades 5 and 6 participate in the same dictation competition: one (1) winner will represent their school in the Regional Finale.
- At the junior high school level, the Grade 7 and Grade 8 students with the best grades will both participate in the National Grand Finale.



THE FONDATION PAUL GÉRIN-LAJOIE COMPETITION

This competition offers each grade level's winners in their School Finale the possibility of winning awards. One student per level has a chance to win a \$100 scholarship.

ELEMENTARY

MARCH

Stage 3 • Regional Finales

- The students representing each school participate in the dictation for their region's **Regional Finale**.
- The winners for each region will participate in the International Grand Finale.

MAY

Stage 4 • International Grand Finale

- Students representing the different regions participate in the International Grand Finale.
- This televised event brings together students from Quebec, Canada, the United States, and Africa.
- Scholarships are awarded to the winners in the Francophone and French as a Second Language categories.

JUNIOR HIGH

MAY

Stage 3 • International Grand Finale

- The students representing each school participate in the dictation for the National Grand Finale.
- Three academic scholarships are awarded to the winners.

THREE WAYS TO PARTICIPATE

La Dictée P.G.L.'s goal is to get the greatest number of students possible involved in this inclusive and unifying project. Choose from three different ways to participate:



With P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share

Students raise funds within the framework of a sponsored dictation. This option allows participating classes to keep up to 50% of the amount that they raise to carry out their own educational activities. The other 50% allows the Foundation to further its educational programs.

Without P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share (new)

Schools who would like to participate in the project without having to participate in the fundraiser will be able to do so and receive free access to our educational tools and this year's competitions.

With a flat-rate contribution

The school pays a flat-rate fee per registered student which allows the Foundation to further its international educational programs



P.G.L. RAISE FUNDS TO SHARE



When participating in La Dictée P.G.L., schools can contribute to the project through the P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser

WHAT IS IT?

The P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser is the essence of La Dictée P.G.L. It is an opportunity for students to practise solidarity, sharing, and cooperation while bringing concrete support to children around the world.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share campaign is the fundraising component of the sponsored dictation. This dictation is an exercise found in the Teaching Guide. Each student's mission is to have their dictation sponsored by their parents. We recommend donating to the P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser based on the number of words the students write correctly.

SIGNIFICANT FINANCIAL BENEFITS FOR PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS

Classes that participate in the P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser see significant financial benefits through La Dictée P.G.L., while students use their French skills to raise money. Of the money raised, half is kept by the school for educational activities. The Foundation receives the other half which it uses to further its education programs abroad.

Since 1991, nearly **\$13,012,100** of the \$29,576,964 raised through the P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser **has been invested** in projects at participating schools!

The P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser is a unique opportunity to transform students' knowledge into a global citizen experience and give them the opportunity to become links in the chain of human solidarity.

QUALITY EDUCATION FOR ALL, AT HOME AND ABROAD

Since its creation in 1991, La Dictée P.G.L. has provided funding for the Fondation Paul Gérin-Lajoie's many projects. Thanks to the money raised through the P.G.L. Raise Funds to Share fundraiser, the Foundation is able to achieve its ambitions abroad, especially for girls and women.

THE ÉDUFAM PROJECT

One of the projects that the Foundation is implementing will have the following outcomes by the end of 2024:

Empower victims of conflict through education:

- 22,314 girls, teens and women, specifically refugees and displaced persons, will receive support from the project.
- 1,280 teenagers and women in vulnerable situations will receive vocational training and support in the growth of income-generating activities.

Contribute to equal access for the most vulnerable girls and teenagers to an inclusive education at the primary and secondary levels:

- 1,500 girls and teenagers who do not attend school or who have dropped out of school will start or return to school.
- 565 girls and teens will receive support in the form of scholarships to continue their schooling at the secondary level, including in the fields of science, math, and technology.

Promote an improved delivery of quality, safe, inclusive, and gender-equal formal education and vocational training for the most vulnerable girls, teenagers, and women:

- 24 primary and secondary schools will be renovated and equipped to meet the needs of students, including refugees and displaced persons; Schools will also receive support in the establishment of measures to protect children and combat sexual and gender-based violence.
- 762 educational actors will receive support and reinforcement in order to provide higher quality, inclusive, and gender- and conflict-sensitive educational programs.

Raise the voice and promote leadership among the most vulnerable girls, teens, and women in their decision-making processes and in their advocacy of their right to education:

- 36 awareness campaigns will be led on reducing obstacles and barriers to girls' education.
- 150 change agents will be mobilized to promote girls' education and the fight against sexual and gender-based violence.
- 3 mechanisms will be established for the prevention, alerting, reporting, and referring of sexual and gender-based violence cases in communities.
